Mission: To provide the leadership required to develop, implement, evaluate, advocate and identify resources to continuously improve pediatric palliative and hospice care for all children and their families throughout Florida.

Who we are: The Florida Pediatric Palliative Care Consortium (FLPPCC) is a public-private-academic sector partnership established to implement a comprehensive state-wide system that supports perinatal, infant, child and adolescent palliative and hospice care. The Consortium will work with all partners including: service providers, professional educators, social marketing, advocacy, public policy, and research, to affect optimal outcomes for children and families coping with serious and/or chronic health conditions throughout the life course from conception into adulthood.

The Partnership's activities focus on four primary areas, or "PILLARS", of activity:

1) Education, 2) Advocacy, 3) Quality Assurance/Research, and 4) Access.

The FLPPCC is a joint voluntary project between the Florida Association of Children's Hospitals and Florida Hospices and Palliative Care, Inc.
